🔥 Fire Precautions

On hearing the fire alarm, pupils and staff must leave the building immediately by the nearest safe exit.

Do not stop to collect belongings.

Assemble calmly on the school playground.

Class teachers will take the register & report to Head.

No one may re-enter the building until it is declared safe.

Regular fire drills ensure everyone knows what to do in an emergency and fire alarms are tested regularly.

🔒 Lockdown Procedure

In the unlikely event of a lockdown:

Staff will lock all doors and close windows and blinds.

Pupils and staff must remain quiet and out of sight.

Do **not** use mobile phones unless instructed.

Await further instructions from the Headteacher or emergency services.

The all-clear will be communicated by a designated signal.

Online Safety



We are also dedicated to keeping pupils safe online. Through regular teaching, guidance, and monitoring, we help children understand how to use the internet responsibly. We encourage pupils to think carefully about what they share, treat others with respect, and always speak to a trusted adult if something doesn't feel right. Together, we promote a positive and secure digital experience for all learners. Children sign an agreement at the beginning of the year to indicate their pledge to follow the rules..
